



Introduction

Global money week is an Annual Global Awareness- raising campaign that focuses on ensuring that young people, are financially aware and are gradually acquiring the knowledge, skills, attitude, and behaviours necessary to make sound financial decisions and achieve financial stability, independence, and resilience. This year's 11th edition ran from 20-26 March 2023 under the theme **"Plan your money, Plant your Future."**

Global Money Week Provincial Outreach Schedule

SECZim in partnership with the Reserve Bank of Zimbabwe (RBZ), Insurance and Pensions Commission (IPEC) and other key stakeholders conducted GMW campaigns throughout March 2023, instead of confining themselves to the designated week only, to increase outreach. RBZ and IPEC successfully conducted exhibitions in all four provinces, i.e. Matebeleland North, Matebeleland South, Mashonaland Central and Harare whilst SECZim participated in two provinces, Matebeleland South and Harare. Two SMIs participated in this year's GMW activities alongside SECZIM. The Financial Securities Exchange supported SECZim through sponsorship of some promotional items and participated in Matebeleland North, Matebeleland South and Harare exhibitions. EFE Securities joined the Harare exhibition. SECZim also participated in the CEO's Roundtable sessions which were held on 21st and 23rd March 2023 at the Reserve Bank of Zimbabwe Sports Club.


Below is the itinerary for the 4 provinces where GMW were conducted.

Challenges

SECZim was faced with some challenges as outlined below:

1. Budgetary constraints

Due to insufficient funding for the GMW Activities

- SECZIM could not participate in other provinces i.e. Matebeleland North and Mashonaland Central.
- Inadequate promotional material was produced
- SECZim could not contribute to prizes for the GMW video competition.
- Preferred vehicle type could not be hired (double cab)
- 2. Failure by suppliers to deliver promotional material on time

Recommendations

- 1. Seek sponsorship from amongst Securities Market Intermediaries for promotional material to ensure that adequate quantities are produced.
- 2. Purchase a vehicle which ensures comfort and security for staff members as they conduct outreach activities.
- 3. Planning and coordination must improve
